As far as I can tell, there is no specific gospel work aimed at them. Being a church-on-mission, we would like to do something about that. We would like to provide a support network for blokes working four hours inland - such as, running Bible studies on or near the mines, and be the home base for them and their families, providing much need Christian community support.

We have introductory courses for people asking questions about Christianity, we preach the good news of God's saving grace, by faith alone in Christ alone, and we are developing a network of like-minded churches throughout the region.

On top of all that: we are a regular bunch of people. I ride a motorbike, love 4WDing in Byfield National Park, have four kids, a wonderful lady, and a glorious God.
